Note: The Greek word for worship is proskuneo. It is used of God the Father in Matt. 4:10, John 4:21-24, I Cor. 14:25, and Rev. 4:10, and with regard to Jesus in Matt. 2:2, 8, 11; 8:2; 9:18; 14:33; 15:25,; 18:26; 20:20; John 9:38 and 20:28.

Note: The word for "first-born" in Col. 1:15-18 is the Greek word *prōtotokos*, rather than *prōtoktisis*: or "first-created." One writer on this subject points out that *prōtotokos* … "may denote either priority in time or supremacy in rank, meaning that Christ is before all creation … and also over it in rank … and supremacy. " The firstborn was the heir: who inherited his father's entire estate.
